In appreciation for the service and sacrifices of North Carolina's war veterans, a four-year scholarship program at North Carolina approved schools has been established for the qualifying children of certain class or category of deceased, disabled, combat, or POW/MIA veterans.

<p>Residency Requirements: (1) At time of application, applicant must be under age 25; a resident and Domiciled in North Carolina; (2) Veteran parent was a legal resident of North Carolina at the time of said veteran's entrance into that period of service in the armed forces during which eligibility is established; OR (3) The applicant is a child, as that term is defined in 37 U.S.C. § 401 who was born in North Carolina and has been a resident of North Carolina continuously since birth.</p>						Provide Financial Data - Classes 1A, 1B, II, III and IV (Financial Questionnaire & tax return)

NOTE (1): For definition of an eligible veteran and eligible child, common to all eligibility classes, as well as other details, refer to the full text of the law.

NOTE (2): Provision exempts books, computers and supplies (G.S. 143B, Article 14).

NOTE (3): Classes IA, IB, & IV must be submitted on/before December 1 to be awarded on or about January 1; or June 1 to be awarded on or about July 1st.

Qualifying Criteria for Veteran Parent:

The veteran's qualifying criteria must have occurred during a period of war. (Exception: Eligibility may exist for peacetime veterans or reservists/National Guard if disability or death was incurred as a result of armed conflict or while engaged in extra-hazardous service.)

1. Dies during wartime service or service connected death (1); or
2. 100% totally disabled due to war time disability (1); or
3. 20-90% service connected or received Purple Heart due to war time disability (2); or
4. In receipt of non-service connected pension, or received campaign medal, or veteran parent is deceased (2); or
5. Former POW or MIA (1)
