Qualifying Criteria for Veteran Parent:

The veteran's qualifying criteria must have occurred during a period of war. (Exception: Eligibility may exist for peacetime veterans or reservists/National Guard if disability

or death was incurred as a result of armed conflict or while engaged in extra-hazardous service.)

1. Dies during wartime service or service connected death (1); or

2. 100% totally disabled due to war time disability (1); or

3. 20-90% service connected or received Purple Heart due to war time disability (2); or

4. In receipt of non-service connected pension, or received campaign medal, or veteran parent is deceased (2); or

5. Former POW or MIA (1)
